# Young Enterprise Scheme - Qualifications

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# YOUNG ENTERPRISE CERTIFICATE™

## **Level 3; 24 credit equivalents**

The Young Enterprise Certificate is a qualification accredited by NZQA. Because it has fewer than 40 credit equivalents the Young Enterprise Certificate is not registered on the New Zealand Register of Qualifications. No grades are awarded with the qualification.

To gain the Young Enterprise Scheme Certificate, the Young Enterprise student must:

1. Complete the Young Enterprise Scheme “**Course Requirements**” **10 credit equivalents**
2. Pass the “**Young Enterprise Examination**” **14 credit equivalents**

## Young Enterprise Certificate and New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA)

The Young Enterprise Certificate has been granted credit inclusion for the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) at Level 3 (24 Credits) until 31 March 2017

Credit Equivalents are credits deemed to be equivalent to NCEA credits

These qualifications do not appear on the Record of Learning provide by NZQA.

Students are advised by NZQA to use the qualification (and consequent credit equivalents) only if they need these credits to make up to the total credits needed for their NCEA certificate at any one year level. Although the credits are assessed as equivalent to Level 3, they may be applied at any year level of NCEA.

This credit inclusion is limited to NCEA, may only be used once, and may not be used for any other NQF qualifications.”

## University entrance from 2015

University Entrance (UE) will continue to be the minimum requirement to go to a New Zealand university. From 1 March 2014, to be awarded UE you will need:

NCEA Level 3

Three subjects - at **Level 3 or above**, made up of:

14 credits each, in three approved subjects

Literacy - 10 credits at **Level 2 or above**, made up of:

5 credits in reading

5 credits in writing

Numeracy - 10 credits at Level 1 or above, made up of:

achievement standards – specified achievement standards available through a range of subjects, or

unit standards - package of 3 numeracy unit standards (26623, 26626, 26627 all 3 required)
