

BP Business Challenge 2019



A fun and authentic way to engage your students with experiential learning

The BP Business Challenge is a unique 3 day experiential learning programme that develops skills, understandings and attitudes about how a successful business operates and connects the students with their local business community.

In 2019, the programme will run in about 40 schools around the country with up to 80 Year 11 students participating in each challenge.

- *Team work*
- *Leadership*
- *Presentation skills*
- *Problem solving*
- *Business fundamentals*
- *Communication*

The programme is run by two external facilitators who have practical business experience and a background in working with young people.

On the final day, the students present their business ideas, creations and discoveries to a panel of judges at a business expo. The judges, who are typically local business people, celebrities and MPs evaluate each team's presentation and determine a winning team.

What the students do

In just three days the students:

- Form a virtual company with directors roles
- Devise a product which solves a problem
- Research the product, target market and competition
- Develop a business plan
- Present their business plan to the judges

Requirements

To host a challenge, your school must provide:

- Participation of 80 students
- Appropriate venue (e.g. school hall)
- Access to computers and printer for students
- Data projector and speaker system
- Teacher support for three days
- Lunch for presenters and judges

Combined school challenges work really well

Students who participate in a combined school challenge often say that the opportunity to work with students from another school is a highlight. It fosters their ability to adapt to change, collaborate in teams, and grows their confidence with communication.
